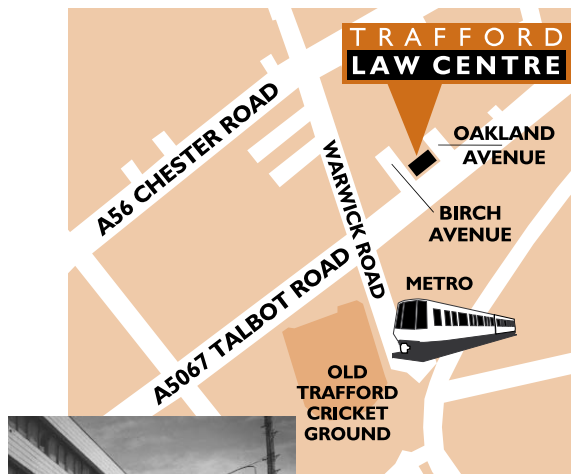
Our caseworkers are normally very busy you and will usually have to wait a little while for an appointment. PLEASE DO NOT DELAY IN CONTACTING US.

employment

housing

immigration

mental health

Our services are primarily for people who live or work in the borough of Trafford; however we may be able to help you if you live outside the area.

If you have difficulty travelling to the Law Centre we may on some occasions be able to arrange to visit you at home.

employment

Unfair dismissal, discrimination (race, sex, disability, religious and sexual orientation), wages, notice pay, maternity rights, redundancy, terms and conditions of employment.

housing

Rehousing, succession, security of tenure, homelessness, tenants rights, antisocial behaviour, possession claims, disrepair.

immigration

Nationality, asylum, deportation and terms of entry or stay in the UK. Problems with NASS and proceedings before the Immigration Appellate Authority.

mental health

We cover all aspects of the mental health law and issues relating to treatment and care in hospital and in the community, representation before Mental Health Review Tribunals and assistance with Managers hearings.

All our services are free, but as we are funded by the Legal Services Commission the assistance we are able to give may be limited if you are not eligible under the legal help scheme.

To be eligible your gross household income must be around £2,250 per month or less, your disposable income after deductions such as housing costs must be £621 per month or less and your savings must not be more than £3,000.

If you are unsure whether or not you are eligible, please do not hesitate to contact us. Even if you are not eligible we can still give you free initial advice.
